SEASON NOTES

The Cardinals completed their 122nd season of play in the National League with an 97-65 mark, winning the N.L. Central for the 9th time and the first time since 2009.

It was the 24th 1st place finish for the Cardinals. They have finished 1st or 2nd in the N.L. Central each of the past 5 seasons.

The Cardinals put together the 73rd winning season (+.500) in franchise history. The Cardinals have now compiled six consecutive winning seasons, doing so for the 3rd time in franchise history.

The Cardinals won 54 home games, 2nd only to Atlanta (56). It was their most ever home wins in a single season since moving into Busch Std. III in 2006. The Cardinals have won an N.L.-best 385 home games since 2006.

The Cardinals went a combined 27-28 (11-8 vs. CIN, 9-10 vs. PIT, 3-4 vs. ATL, 3-4 vs. LAD and 1-2 vs. OAK) against teams in the postseason.

The Cardinals posted 15 shutout wins and were blanked 11 times. They posted shutouts in 3 of their final 5 wins. They were 6-6 in extra inning games.

The Cardinals winningest day of the week was on Tuesdays (17-8) and their worst day was Mondays & Thursdays (9-8).

The Cardinals had a +187 run scored differential (783-596), the best in the N.L. and 2nd only to Boston (+197) in the majors.

The Cardinals were 83-14 (.856) when scoring 4 or more runs and 92-23 (.800 win pct.) when scoring 3 or more runs.

□ N.L. CENTRAL CHAMPS: The 2013 N.L. Central Division Champion St. Louis Cardinals concluded their 122nd season of play in the National League at a season-high 32 games over .500...won their first NL Central title since 2009 by winning their most games (97) since 2005 (100)...the Cardinals earned the top-seed in the National League playoffs as well as home field advantage, matching Boston for the best record in the majors...POST-CARDS: The Cardinals have achieved their third-straight postseason appearance and their 11th in 18 seasons under their current ownership group headed by Bill DeWitt, Jr.

□ BANNERS IN THE BOARDROOM: Under the ownership of Bill DeWitt, Jr. and his partners, the Cardinals have posted a 1593-1321 record (.547 win pct., 4th-best in majors) since 1996, advancing to the postseason 11 times, including 10 times in the past 14 seasons. The Cardinals were N.L. Champions in 2004, 2006 and 2011 and captured their 10th World Championship in 2006 and their 11th World title in 2011. The Cardinals 57 postseason wins since 1996 are 2nd in the majors (NY Yankees, 97). "MO"-MENTUM: The Cardinals have advanced to the postseason in four (2009, '11, '12, '13) of their six seasons under GM John "Mo" Mozeliak.

□ MANAGING JUST FINE: Mike Matheny, who last year became the first rookie manager to lead the Cardinals to the postseason since Eddie Dyer did so in 1946, is now the first Cardinals manager to pilot the Redbirds to the postseason in each of his first two full seasons with the ballclub...he is the 8th manager all-time to have done so, joining Ron Gardenhire (2002-04), Bob Brenly (2001-02), Larry Dierker (1997-99), Ralph Houk (1961-63), Mickey Cochrane (1934-35), Bucky Harris (1924-25) and Hughie Jennings (1907-09). (Elias)

□ CARDS & PIRATES: The Cardinals are meeting the Pirates for the first time ever in postseason play...the Cardinals were 9-10 against the Pirates this season, going 6-3 at Busch Stadium & 3-7 at PNC Park...the Cardinals swept their last series meeting (Sept. 6-8 at Busch) and have won 4-straight against the Bucs...the Cards trail their all-time series with Pittsburgh, 1,076-1,127...the Cardinals are 37-24 (.607) at home against Pittsburgh since 2006 when Busch Stadium III opened...they are 65-44 (.596), the most all-time wins by an opponent, at PNC Park which opened in 2001.

□ DIVISION SERIES: The Cardinals are a combined 26-12 (.684 winning pct.) in Division Series games and have won eight of the 10 Division Series that they have taken part in, including four by 3-0 sweeps...the only Division Series that they have failed to win were in 2001 vs. Arizona when they were considered the Wild Card team and they stretched that series to a fifth and final game and in 2009 when they were swept in three games by the Dodgers...the Cardinals .684 winning pct. in DS play is tops among clubs with a minimum of 15 games played...this is the sixth time in 11 Division Series appearances that the Cards will open at home...they are 4-0 in Division Series with home field advantage...overall, they are 13-5 in Division Series home games...HIGH FIVE: The Cardinals are 9-2 in their previous best-of-five postseason series, posting an overall record of 29-12 in those games...aside from their seven Division Series best-of-five wins, the Cardinals also defeated the Atlanta Braves, 3-0, in the old best-of-five League Championship Series format in 1982.

□ GAME ONE'S: In Cardinals' playoff history, St. Louis has an overall record of 18-21 in Game 1 action and is 6-4 (4-1 at home) in Division Series Game 1's...since 1987, in postseason series that involved St. Louis, the winner of Game 1 has gone on to win 17 of the 23 series...St. Louis owns an all-time record of 116-101 in postseason games...AGAINST THE CENTRAL: The Cardinals are 2-1 in postseason series in which they were matched up against NL Central Division representatives...they defeated Houston in the 2004 NLCS (4-3), lost to Houston in 2005 NLCS (2-4) and defeated Milwaukee in the 2011 NLCS (4-2).

□ DUCK HUNTERS: The Cardinals led the majors with a .330 BA with runners in scoring position (top ML mark on record dating to 1974), including a .305 BA with runners in scoring position and 2 outs...they batted .370 with the bases loaded, belting four grand slams...the Cardinals had an N.L.-best 287 two-out RBI.

□ FAN CLUB: The Cardinals starting pitchers recorded 806 strikeouts, their most since fanning 829 1969.

□ STINGY STARTERS: Cardinals starting pitchers had the majors 2nd best staff ERA (3.42) behind only the Dodgers (3.13) and their lowest since 1988 (3.33). WINNING WAYS: The starting staff accounted for 77 of the team's 97 wins, their most since 2005 when they posted 81 of the club's 100 W's.

□ FINEST IN THE FIELD: The 2013 Cardinals set the franchise mark for fewest errors (75) and highest fielding percentage (.988) in a single season...it bested their previous marks of 77 errors and .987 fielding percentage in 2003.

□ ROOKIE REDBIRDS: The Cardinals had a Major League-leading 36 combined wins from rookie pitchers in 2013, their most since 1941 when they received the franchise record of 42 led by Ernie White (17-7) and Howie Krist (10-0) (Elias)...they used 20 rookies this season - their most since employing 21 in 1970...the Cardinals had 67 games that were started by pitchers age 25 or younger, going 45-27 with a 3.10 ERA in those games.

□ BELTRAN AT HIS BEST: Carlos Beltran owns some of the game's top all-time marks in postseason play, leading all active players in BA (.363), on-base pct. (.470) & slugging pct. (.782) while ranking 3rd in HR's (14) in his 34 games played.

□ STREAKING INTO OCTOBER: The Cardinals finished the season with a six-game winning streak and have several players who completed the regular season with significant streaks heading into the postseason...Jon Jay has hit safely in a career-best 13-straight games; Matt Holliday has reached base safely in 7-straight plate appearances and scored in 8-straight games; reliever Kevin Siegrist finished the year with the majors longest active scoreless innings streak (25.0), while Lance Lynn (11.1) and Michael Wacha (10.1) also finished the year with double-digit scoreless streaks.

## CARDINALS IN POSTSEASON PLAY

### **MATT ADAMS • 1B • L/R • 25 yrs • #53**

- Is playing in his first MLB postseason after his first full-season with St. Louis.

### **JOHN AXFORD • RHP • R/R • 30 yrs • #34**

- This is his 2nd trip to the postseason after playing with Milwaukee Brewers during the 2011 championship season.
- Pitched in 3 DS games vs. Arizona (1-0, 4.0IP, R) and pitched 3.0 scoreless innings over 3 games vs. St. Louis during '11 NLCS.

### **CARLOS BELTRAN • OF • S/R • 36 yrs • #3**

- Playing in his fourth postseason and second as a Cardinal. Appeared in both DS and NLCS with Houston in 2004 and the Mets in 2006, facing STL in the NLCS both times.
- Owns a .363 career postseason average (45-124) and hit .357 in '12 postseason w/hits in 10 of 12 games. Has 14 PS HRs, and tied ML record with eight postseason HRs in 2004, as well as homering in five consecutive games (Gm 5 DS-Gm 4 NLCS).
- Has a career .408 avg in DS, w/6HR and 14 RBI; 7 of 13 games have been multi-hit gms.

### **MATT CARPENTER • 2B • L/R • 27 yrs • #13**

- The All-Star 2nd-baseman will be playing in his 2nd postseason. During 2012, had one AB in Wild Card game, 4 ABs in DS and started LCS Gm 4 and 6 (3-9). Hit HR in Gm 3.

### **ADRON CHAMBERS • OF • L/L • 26 yrs • #56**

- This is the OF's third trip to the postseason with STL. The 2011 & 2012 September call-up was able to take part in St. Louis' last two postseasons due to injuries.
- Appeared in seven games during 2012 PS, 2 DS games vs. WSH, both times as PR.

### **RANDY CHOATE • LHP • L/L • 37 yrs • #36**

- This is the veterans 4th playoff appearance, 1st with St. Louis.
- Made one app. each in the DS and ALCS with the Yankees in 2000. Was added to the Yanks WS roster in 2001 and appeared in Games 1 and 6. Pitched a scoreless inning over 3 games with Tampa Bay in 2010 DS.

### **ALLEN CRAIG • IF/OF • R/R • 28 yrs • #21**

- This will be Allen's third-straight postseason.
- Appeared in all 13 PS games for STL in 2013 and in 15 games in 2011. Has 5 home runs in the PS, including three in the 2011 WS.
- Caught the last out of WS Gm 7; hit a HR in the 3rd that put the team ahead for good.

### **TONY CRUZ • C • R/R • 27 yrs • #48**

- Will be on his 2nd postseason roster. In 2012 caught one inn. in DS, and had one AB during LCS. Travelled with the club during the 2011 postseason, but was not on roster.

### **DANIEL DESCALSO • INF • L/R • 26 yrs • #33**

- This is his 3rd postseason. Started & played every inning of all 13 games at 2nd during '12 PS except 1/2 inn. of LCS Gm 7.
- Hit .316 w/6 hits and 6RBI during DS vs. WSH last year. Had a 2RBI single in the bott. of the 9th of Gm 5 to tie the game at 7-7.
- Played in 13 games during the 2011 postseason, appearing at 3B, SS and 2B.
- Recorded 2 hits during the '11 WS, both in Gm 6, including a lead-off single in the 10th to start the rally and later scored.

### **SAM FREEMAN • LHP • R/L • 26 yrs • #71**

- This will be the young lefthanders 2nd postseason experience. Was on the roster during the Cardinals Wild Card game of 2012, but did not appear in the game.

### **DAVID FREESE • 3B • R/R • 30 yrs • #23**

- This is David's 3rd-straight season to be in the postseason. Hit .277 during 2012 PS, but .421 (8-19) during the DS. Walked w/2 on & 2outs in Gm 5 clincher to extend the 9th.
- Was named the 2011 NLCS and WS MVP. Played in all 18 games.
- Holds the MLB all-time postseason mark with 21 RBI (2011) and his 50 total bases set a new MLB PS record. Batted .278 during the DS, .545 with 3HR, 9 RBI in the NLCS and .348 in the WS.

### **MATT HOLLIDAY • OF • R/R • 33 yrs • #7**

- Will be playing in his 5th postseason. Was named the NLCS MVP with Colorado in 2007 after batting .333 with 2 HRs and 4RBI in the Rockies four-game sweep over Arizona.
- Hit .435 during the NLCS in 2011 for STL. Played the first 6 games of the WS before being taken off the roster in Gm 7 due to a right hand injury.

### **JON JAY • OF • L/L • 28 yrs • #19**

- Playing in his 3rd postseason. Played CF in all 13 PS games in 2012 and appeared in all 18 games for STL in 2011.
- In 2012 DS vs. WSH, drove in 3 runs in DS Gm 2 & had 2 hits in Gm 3. Robbed Chase Utley of a hit at the wall during decisive DS Gm 5 (2011) in 1-0 game.

### **ROB JOHNSON • C • R/R • 31 yrs • #32**

- This is his first time playing in the postseason.

### **JOE KELLY • RHP • R/R • 25 yrs • #58**

- Is pitching in his 2nd postseason after appearing in 7 games during the team's 2012 playoffs.
- Threw 6 consec. scoreless outing (7.0IP) before allowing runs in Gm 7 of NLCS. Had 3.2 hitless IP during DS vs. WSH, including 1.2 in Gm 5.

### **PETE KOZMA • SS • R/R • 25 yrs • #38**

- Is his 2nd postseason after the 2012 Sept. call-up was the starting shortstop in all 13 gms during 2012 PS. Hit a 3-run HR during DS Gm 3, 4-0 win at WSH.
- Had 2 hits in DS Gm 5, the biggest a 2RBI single in 9th that gave Cards the 9-7 lead/win.

### **LANCE LYNN • RHP • R/R • 26 yrs • #31**

- This is his 3rd postseason. Appeared in 3 games during the DS vs. WSH in 2012 (3.1IP).
- Was added to the team's postseason roster during the 2011 LCS and WS rounds.
- Made 5 scoreless relief app. (5.1IP) in 2011 NLCS.
- Started Gm 1 and Gm 5 of 2012 NLCS.

### **TYLER LYONS • LHP • S/L • 25 yrs • #70**

- This is the rookie lefthander's 1st postseason experience.

### **SETH MANESS • RHP • R/R • 24 yrs • #61**

- Rookie is playing in his 1st MLB postseason. Made 2 starts in the Texas League playoffs in 2012 (0-1, 2.08 ERA, 13.0 IP, 8K).

### **CARLOS MARTINEZ • RHP • R/R • 22 yrs • #62**

- Is the rookie's 1st PS after being recalled 5 separate times during the regular season.
- Worked 7.0 scoreless IP in Gm 1 of 2012 Texas League (AA) Championship Series.

*St. Louis is 6-1 in 7 postseason games played on October 3.*

Date	Game
1926	St. Louis defeated New York 6-2 in Game 2 of the World Series. Grover Cleveland Alexander struck out 10 and 4 hits. Billy Southworth & Tommy Thevenow homered, driving in 4 of the Cards' 6 runs.
1934	St. Louis defeated Detroit 8-3 in Game 1 of the World Series. Dizzy Dean earned the win as the Tigers made five errors in the first three innings.
1968	St. Louis lost to Detroit 8-1 in Game 2 of the World Series. Mickey Lolich went the distance for the win and also hit one of the Tigers' 3 home runs.
1996	St. Louis won 5-4 in Game 2 of the Division Series with San Diego. Tom Pagnozzi singled home the go-ahead run in the bottom of the 8th. Ron Gant hit a bases-clearing 3-run double in the 5th.
2000	St. Louis wins Game 1, 7-5, of the Division Series with Atlanta. The Cardinals explode for 6 runs in the first inning off Greg Maddux. Jim Edmonds homered in the win that saw Rick Ankiel throw a record 5 wild pitches in the 3rd inning.
2002	Chuck Finley kept Arizona scoreless through seven in a 2-1 St. Louis win in Game 2 of the Division Series. J.D. Drew hit a solo homer (3rd) and Edgar Renteria scored the winning run in the top of the 9th.
2006	Won 5-1 at San Diego in Game 1 of the Division Series. Albert Pujols put the Cards on board with a 2-run HR in the 4th as the team belted out 12 hits during the game. Chris Carpenter earned the win with 6.1 IP.

### **SHELBY MILLER • RHP • R/R • 22 yrs • #40**

- Is his 2nd postseason app. for St. Louis. Did not appear in the DS in 2012, but pitched in relief in Gm 2 and 6 of the LCS vs. SF.

### **YADIER MOLINA • C • R/R • 31 yrs • #4**

- Catcher will make his 7th appearance in the postseason for St. Louis (2004-06, 09, 11-13) after 10 seasons in the Majors.
- Was the first Cards catcher to ever appear in the postseason five different years.
- Caught all but one inning during the 2012 PS and hit a combined .265 (13-49) with 4RBI.

### **EDWARD MUJICA • RHP • R/R • 29 yrs • #44**

- This is his 2nd trip to the postseason after appearing in 9 games for STL during 2012.
- Pitched in 3 of the DS games vs. WSH (3.0 inn.) and allowed one run.

### **SHANE ROBINSON • OF • R/R • 28 yrs • #43**

- Is the outfielder's 2nd postseason. Appeared in 10 gms w/ 9 plate apps during 2012.

### **TREVOR ROSENTHAL • RHP • R/R • 23 yrs • #26**

- This is his 2nd postseason. Struck out 15 batters over 8.2 scoreless IP (7 games) during 2012. His 0.00 ERA tied Josh Kinney & Adam Wainwright (both 2006) as the only 3 Cards pitchers to not allow a run in 5 or more apps in a postseason.

### **KEVIN SIEGRIST • LHP • L/L • 24 yrs • #46**

- This is his first PS with the Cardinals. Made 2 starts in the Texas League playoffs in 2012, going 1-1 with a 4.22 ERA striking out 9 in 10.2 IP.

### **MICHAEL WACHA • RHP • R/R • 22 yrs • #52**

- This is the rookies 1st PS in St. Louis. The 2012 1st round draft pick appeared in 2 games of the Texas League playoffs last season and struck out 5 in 2.0 scoreless inn.

### **ADAM WAINWRIGHT • RHP • R/R • 32 yrs • #50**

- This is Adam's 4th postseason with St. Louis (2006, 2009, 2012-13).
- Started 3 games during the 2012 playoffs. Started DS Gm 1 vs. WSH and fanned 10 in 5.2 IP allowing one run but did not get a decision in the team's 3-2 loss.
- Was the pitcher on the mound to send STL to the WS in GM 6 of the NLCS in 2006 vs. NYM; and ended the 2006 WS with a strikeout to earn the save vs. Detroit.

### **JAKE WESTBROOK • RHP • R/R • 36 yrs • #35**

- This is the veterans' 4th postseason experience (Cleveland 2007, STL 2011-13).
- Did not appear on the roster in '12 after a late-season injury. Did not pitch in the DS in '11, but made 2 scoreless apps in the WS, and earned the win in Gm 6 comeback.

### **KOLTEN WONG • 2B • L/R • 22 yrs • #16**

- This is the rookie's 1st PS with St. Louis, but the 2011 1st round draft pick has experienced postseason ball in both seasons in the minors.
- Played in 9 Texas League (AA) playoff games in 2012 and started all 7 Midwest League (A) playoff games in 2011.
